Dear Professor Hosler:

I appreciate your fine letter of January 31. It was extremely interesting to read of your very rewarding experiences with Professor Negovsky. I had the pleasure of visiting his laboratory and, naturally, I would like to be of every possible assistance in furthering Russian - US cooperation in resuscitation research.

In the not too distant future, I am going to take up with Ambassador A. Maschikov a host of very fine suggestions, which have come to me from prominent American physicians like yourself, for further US-Soviet collaboration, e.g., in a world conference on resuscitation as you suggest.

I am compiling several of these recommendations which have come in, and as soon as I have heard some reaction from the Soviets, I shall be happy to let you know. As you know, however, some time may elapse before the Embassy here can secure a reaction from Moscow.

I know, however, that each of my suggestions to Soviet authorities for medical teamwork has been very warmly received.

In resuscitation, as you know far better than I, there are common links among all peoples to fight back the processes of death; certainly, therefore, no ideological or Cold War barrier should mar our cooperation.
